what [is] your life? It is even  
a vapour, appearing for a little  
while, and then disappearing,  
15 instead of your saying, If the  
Lord should [so] will and we  
should live, we will also do this  
or that.

Do you ever consider what may or may not be the **Lord's** will for you each day?

Do you ever actually say "If the Lord should will and I live, I will do this or that, or go here or there?"

The man in the parable left God out of his plans altogether.

Nor did he consider how fragile and brief
